Our follow up to last month's testimonies continue to show the confidence people have in Blessed Peter Vigne. During the home visits of the statue of Father Vigne around the parish, families not only took him into their homes but also into their hearts, resulting in many graces. Francisco Clebson 21 years of age, injured in an accident, was taken to Barbalha where he remained in a coma, in intensive care. His condition continued to cause concern. Someone thought of bringing the statue to his home. His mother readily agreed and joined in the prayer of intercession for the recovery of her son; that he would wake up from the coma and be able to go home regardless of his physical condition. The next day Clebson woke from the coma and came out of intensive care. A few days later he returned home and resumed his usual activities. That is the latest information we have.



JESUS.... AT THE CENTRE OF THE YEAR

"We can compare the cosmos to a "book" – Galileo himself used this example – and " consider it as "the work of an author who expresses himself through the 'symphony' of creation. In this symphony one finds, at a certain point, what would be called in musical terms a 'solo', a theme entrusted to a single instrument or voice which is so important that the meaning of the entire work depends on it. THIS "SOLO" IS JESUS. ... The Son of Man recapitulates in himself earth and heaven, creation and the Creator, flesh and Spirit. He is the centre of the cosmos



issionary activity was particularly important throughout Father VI Vigne's life. What was happening for him 300 years ago? The Congregation of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament was already four years in existence, and our missionary priest, so highly esteemed by the clergy and those who met him or heard him preach was in constant demand by the bishops. His diary for 1719 filled up very quickly with requests for help coming from several dioceses. The long lonely roads that wound their way through the mountains, echoed to the sound of the

heavy clogs of our intrepid missionary, as he made his way intent on bringing to others the light and consolation of the Good News. On February 22 he arrived in Allex where the mission he preached was much appreciated. At Easter, he left for Pradelles in the

Auvergne Region where he was invited to preach. Before undertaking any mission work he made sure to obtain from the local bishop the faculty to hear confessions and the authority to preach. The reply from Bishop Gabriel de Cosnac, Bishop of Die, on March 23, 1719 to one such request, shows how well he esteemed this missionary priest who was 49 years of age: "Believe me when I say, no one could be more touched than I am by the kindness you have shown me and by your edifying and tender zeal for holiness in the diocese. So it is with great pleasure that I grant you permission to hold missions in Pradelles, Brettes, Béconne and wherever else in my diocese you are needed. Convinced of your Prudence and spiritual insight, I give you permission to forgive the sins reserved to me alone by virtue of my office. You may use this letter as a "celebret" in any parish in my diocese. Please remember me whenever you celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Your most humble and obedient servant. Gabriel Bishop of Die" Ten years later the same bishop asked Fr. Vigne to send some of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament to Die. This, further confirms his esteem for him and the Congregation he founded.

On May 15, 1719 his missionary journeys took him to Saint-Benoît and to Saillans. He then evangelised in the diocese of Gap where he preached three major missions in Neffes and Curbans both villages in Provence. He travelled throughout the Hautes-Alpes where he visited families and met abandoned children. In October of that same year he went to Salette, known to us today because of the Apparition of Our Lady in 1846. At the end of November he left for the Hautes-Alpes, this time to St-Didier in Dévoluy....As directed by the bishops, the aim of his missions was always to rebuild Church unity, still impacted by the wars of religion. Fr. Veyrenc writing in 1868 said: "For a long flight one needs a lot of air and strong wings. To preach from so many pulpits, addressing so many varied congregations, never yielding under the load, constantly sought out, called upon, heard with delight, are the characteristics of God's special envoy..." At least eight of his missions lasted at least three weeks and some more than a month. Peter Vigne was passionate about his mission to the people he loved, who listened anxiously to sermons that touched their lives and awakened and strengthened their faith. 1719 was a very busy year for him with so much missionary work and without "holidays". Fr. Vigne spent the last month of the year-in-Boucieu-le-Roi where he preached to pilgrims doing the Stations of the Cross and also gave a Retreat! What will 2019 ask of us? It will surely challenge us to a renewed missionary awakening!.

"YOU TOO need to see the entirety of your life as a mission. Try to do so by listening to God in prayer and recognizing the signs that he gives you. Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its
